**NATIONAL CHARITY LEAGUE, INC. FORMS NEW CHAPTER IN
CHARLOTTE, NC**

Costa Mesa, CA (Dec. 3, 2019) – [National Charity League, Inc.](#) (NCL), the nation’s premier mother-daughter non-profit organization, has announced the formation of the Charlotte Chapter. This is the organization’s 271st chapter to form in the United States.

The Charlotte Chapter is open to mothers and daughters who reside in or attend school in the Charlotte, NC area. This chapter, combined with the existing chapters (Cardinal, Carolina Lily, Dogwood, Lake Norman, Longleaf Pine, Outer Banks, and Sea Turtle) brings the total number of North Carolina NCL Members to over 1,500. Last year, the existing chapters served 30,840 philanthropy hours and supported over 100 philanthropy partners.

In addition to participating in national philanthropic initiatives, the chapter’s inaugural members will have the opportunity to choose which local organizations they will support through hands-on volunteer service hours. Daughters in 7th through 12th grade, known as Ticktockers, and their mothers, known as Patronesses, will together embark on a core program focused on philanthropy, strengthening mother-daughter relationships, cultural experiences and leadership opportunities.

“North Carolina is fortunate to have this amazing new chapter of women in their state,” said Renée Tuzee, CEO, National Charity League, Inc. “Like the existing chapters in North Carolina that paved the way for future growth, I am confident that this group will go above and beyond to spread the philanthropic message of National Charity League’s initiatives to their community.”
