NATIONAL CHARITY LEAGUE, INC. FORMS NEW CHAPTER IN CROSS RIVER, NY

North Westchester County, NY -- December 14, 2020 – [National Charity League, Inc.](#) (NCL), the nation's premier mother-daughter non-profit organization, announced the formation of the Northern Westchester Chapter. This is the organization's 284th chapter to form in the United States.

The Northern Westchester Chapter is open to mothers and daughters who reside in the Northern Westchester County area. This chapter, combined with the existing chapter, Garden City, brings the total number of New York chapters to two, and the total number of active members in the Northeastern region of the United States to over 3,500.

In addition to participating in national philanthropic initiatives, the Chapter's inaugural members will have the opportunity to choose which local organizations they will support through hands-on volunteer service hours. Daughters in 7th through 12th grade, known as Ticktockers, and their mothers, known as Patronesses, will together embark on a core program focused on philanthropy, strengthening mother-daughter relationships, cultural experiences, and leadership opportunities.

"A year ago, I reached out to NCL because I knew the women in this community could make an impact," said Amanda Hufnagel, Chapter President. "I'm so excited to see this come together, to get to know everyone, and to start making a difference in our community."
